A Technical Assistance Inquiry

Q: What should vendors and facilities do if they come across any websites other than https://medicare.gov/dialysisfacilitycompare purporting to display official ICH CAHPS results?

A: CMS and the Coordination Team are aware of websites that appear to display official ICH CAHPS (and other Dialysis Facility Compare (DFC) measures) results. We encourage all vendors and facilities to remind their patients that the only official results that should be considered when researching and comparing ICH facilities are found on the www.medicare.gov DFC webpage.

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Star Ratings on DFC

We determine the star rating for each of the six ICH CAHPS measures by applying a clustering algorithm to the individual measure scores. The overall strategy for this algorithm is to place the CCNs that are the most similar into each star rating. Additionally, the algorithm attempts to make the stars as different as possible. In other words, CCNs that belong to five stars are as different as possible from CCNs that belong to four stars. This is a minimum-maximum approach that makes the stars meaningful.

Once the CCNs are assigned to a star rating for each measure score, we can then examine and report the "cut points" (boundaries). Cut points allow us to define the range for each star rating. For example, a five star on the Global Nephrologist Rating may be a 92% or higher. And the four star cut points for that same measure may range from 85% to 91%. A three star may be 75% to 84%, and so on. Each measure has its own set of cut points. The cut points are recalculated every time the DFC is refreshed.
